It has been a sad month for the island. After many years of ill health, several operations and a tremendous spirit in coping, Celia Yaeman passed away suddenly at her home in Grassy Road on Tuesday, 4th May, 1982.

Celia (nee Snell) was born on Norfolk Island on 2nd August 1906, one of the seven children of Isaac Snell and his wife Mary (nee Adams).
