Fortunately for Anne and her family, being tired from travelling they decided not to go and days later read in all the newspapers about 2 men arrested in an infamous murder and buried bodies racket. "My Lucky Life" Anne told us.

They were also to be in New York on the 11th September 2001 when the World Trade Centre was attacked, but a family wedding forced a change of plans. Luckily for Anne and her family.

Definitely "My Lucky Life" a recuring theme in Anne's life and a interesting and entertaing speech.

Delicious desserts followed Annes speech and a wonderful evening came to an end.
