Leonard Craig Christian-Bailey, a proud Norfolk Islander was born on Boxing Day 1938 at Bishops Court, which was the hospital back in the day, to Dorothy (nee Christian) and George Bailey.

Len's mother always said he had interrupted her Christmas dinner when she had to begin her long buggy ride to Bishops Court!

Len was the youngest of his siblings – the elderst being Bernie, then Norma, then Mick.

He enjoyed his early years on Norfolk, then WWII came and his dad enlisted into the army along with many other Norfolk men. He was to go to the Middle East.

Len and his mum made the trip to Sydney on the 'Merinda' to say goodbye to George however the Japanese came into the war and were cruising in the Pacific. Lens dad was sent to Darwin to install all the barbed wire entanglements on the foreshores.

Len and his mum had to stay in Sydney as it was unsafe to return by sea to Norfolk.

Several years passed, and the other three siblings gradually came to Sydney one by one.

They made their home in Woollahra, in Sydney, after George was discharged from the army.

Len completed his schooling, and then went to technical college part time while working. Nine years later he graduated as a master builder, and went on to become a project manager with a large Australian construction company, F.T. Eastmens & Sons.

During this time Len worked on many significant building projects located in Newcastle, Wollongong, and also, the Munmorah Power Station, Warrangang Power Station Central West N.S.W. and many other multi storied buildings in the Sydney C.B.D.

During those last 2 years at college Len met Helen (Helen being 18 years old and Len was 23)

Their romance continued, they became engaged in 1963 and married in 1965, enjoying 59 years of marriage and devotion. Building their first home in Collaroy Plateau, Northern Beaches, and again Len built a second family home at Cromer, on the Northern Beaches.

Four years later they were blessed with a beautiful daughter, Joanne. Another three years later they were blessed with a beautiful son, Mathew.

In 1975 after selling up in Sydney, Len and his family returned to Norfolk Island to make this their home, it was always Len's dream to come home to Norfolk with his main goal to build the Crest Apartments on Driver Christian Road. This he achieved and they commenced letting their tourist accommodation.

Helen ran the business, and Len built many homes, and other projects on the island from his business known as L.C-B constructions.

It was due to his building career in Australia that he was proud to bring back to Norfolk many new building and concreting techniques and share his knowledge with the community and fellow builders.

Len was on the N.I. Planning Board for many years in a voluntary capacity where his time and knowledge in this capacity was appreciated.

Len enjoyed his building work, and loved what he did. He was a perfectionist, and a pioneer in his field.

He was also the Minister's Warden at 'All Saints' Church, Kingston for many years attending many meetings, etc. in that capacity and assisting the Minister with Holy Communion.

He enjoyed setting up the gear for the pony club (he had a big truck!!) and the school carnival.

Len also loved his Lincoln Red Cattle – initially importing four heifers in calf from Bussleton W.A. In 1994.

When Joanne had James within a few days of the cattle arriving Len suggested they call him Lincoln – "not a chance!!" said Joanne.

Len loved to be 'in a fance', he got so much enjoyment planting his potatoes, veggies, watermelons, rockmelons etc. giving them away most of the time.

He loved his time out in his boat, fishing – this was a special pleasure for him – he loved the sea.

Some 30 years ago Len and Helen commenced the business known as Norfolk Island Mowers – authorised John Deere dealers - still operating today.

Len enjoyed his family, his island home and family heritage – he loved to have a fish fry for the family, loved his grand kids and enjoyed their growth and achievements.

The three boys James, Will and Ben all being 'tradies' and he adored his grandaughters, Anna and

Amy, and more recently his great grandchildren Layla and Grayson.

He was so proud of Joanne and Mathew's achievements in the hospitality industry, so blessed to have seen their success.

Len will be sadly missed by all his family – especially his wife Helen, they have been good mates and a team for 64 years, mostly always together.

Thank you all for coming, especially our close friends and family from overseas to give Len a true 'Norfolk Island send off'.
