He also had a love of cars especially the Big Black 57 Chevey that he had in Lugarno, that he polished every weekend to get Snoop’s little grubby fingers prints off the bonnet. Then there was the Holden Statesmen here on Norfolk that he pestered Farther for, that only came out on bright sunny days to pick up his many girlfriends to go to white oaks.

When his health started to deteriorate he ended up on Dar Randa and was cared for by the wonderful carers.

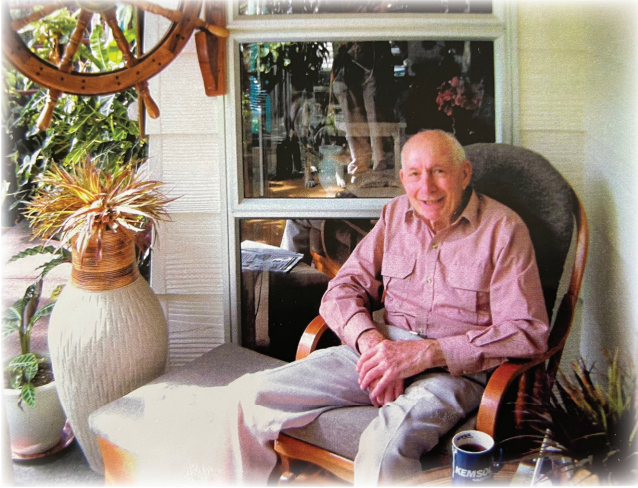
